by following these **5 SMART** rules



Safe

Keep yourself safe by not sharing personal information about yourself - personal information includes: your full name, home address, email address, phone number, photos and where you work or study.



Meeting

Meeting someone who you have only been in touch with online can be dangerous - people can mislead you and not be who they say they are.



Accepting

Accepting emails, instant messages (IM), or opening files, pictures or texts from people you don't know, or trust can lead to problems - they may contain nasty messages or viruses!



Reliable

Information you find on the internet may not be true, or someone online may be lying about who they are.



Tell

If someone or something makes you feel uncomfortable or worried or if you or someone you know is being bullied tell your parent, carer, Tutor, Skills Development Coach or another trusted adult. You can report online abuse to the police at www.thinkuknow.co.uk
